Wood Badge

April 25-27 & May 16-18, 2014 at Cary Camp

Wood Badge is leadership training for volunteer leaders involved in all phases of Scouting - Cub Scouting, Boy Scouting, Exploring, and Venturing, as well as council and district leaders, and professionals. Wood Badge has evolved over the years. Today's Wood Badge focuses on leadership and "people" skills, not Scout craft or outdoor skills. Participants learn how to be better leaders, how to work with teams and lead others, and how to develop and achieve objectives. Wood Badge combines the most current leadership skills used by corporate America with the best of successful outdoor leadership programs and nearly 100 years of Scouting experience. Leadership skills developed through Wood Badge, while obviously applicable to Scouting, will also help participants be more effective leaders at work, at home, or in other volunteer roles.

You must be a registered adult scouter with basic training for your particular scouting position and any Outdoor Skills training appropriate for your position. There are no special physical or outdoor abilities required. You must be able to have fun!

Wood Badge is a six-day course conducted over two full three-day weekends. The first weekend reflects the unit meeting, while the second weekend uses a camping activity as its delivery model. The focus is on leadership skills, not outdoor skills. And did we mention fun?

Philmont 2015

Sagamore Council has been awarded a Philmont Council Trek consisting of two crews for 2015. Arrival date at Philmont is July 15, 2015, and departure for home is July 27, 2015. If train travel is used, as in the past, departure from the Lafayette area will be on July 13 or 14 with a return late in the evening on July 28, 2015. We are looking for a Troop(s) or Crew(s) to organize and lead one or both of the 12 person Trek crews and provide necessary Scouts to fill them.

Trek crews have a minimum of 7 persons with 4 of these being youth. Scouts must be 14 at the time of the Trek or be 13 and have finished 8th grade. Maximum number of adults is 4 for crews of 8 or more, but

youth should have preference. Crews must have at least 2 adults, and 3 are recommended. All persons must meet the height and weight requirements of Philmont and pass a physical on arrival. Expected cost per person is estimated at \$1250 - \$1300, excluding items of a personal nature. Popcorn funds can be used, and limited scholarship funds may be available from Philmont. It is the Council's intent to have both crews filled completely; unused slots will be expected to be advertised council-wide for youth.

Each youth must work through the appropriate age level workbook. After completion, the form in the back of the workbook must be completed and sent to www.pray.pub to obtain the pocket certificate. This certificate may then be brought to the trading post to obtain the youth religious knot.

Adult Religious Knot

Adults must be *nominated* for this award by someone at their church or by someone in the Boy Scouts. The nominated adult must have 5 years of service in the Boy Scouts and must have held a position of service at their church for 5 years. There is a form available through www.pray.pub that must be filled out and sent to this organization with a letter stating why the nominee should be given this award.

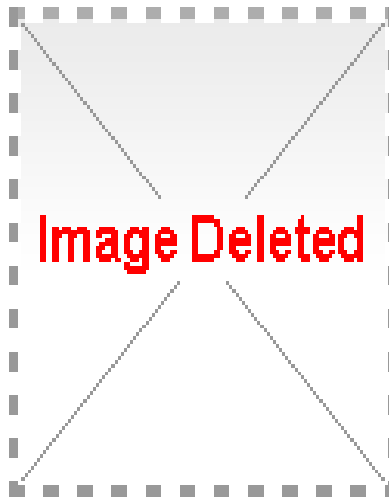
