Clarification Concerning Applications for Financial Assistance for Needy Scouts

The Sagamore Council, Boy Scouts of America, has a Needy Scout fund with monies available for Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and Explorers who are in need of financial help with registration fees. The expense of the uniform, starter patches (Council Strip, World Crest and unit numbers) and the handbook are the parents' responsibility. Baden Powell, founder of the Scout movement, thought it was an important lesson for a Scout to "earn his own way," and we would like to see that in our own Scouting families.

A donor has contributed funds to assist Scouts with shirt expenses, but he would like the Scout and family to have a "vested interest" prior to receiving the assistance. A Scout must achieve his first rank (Bobcat/Scout) prior to qualifying to receive a Needy Scout uniform shirt. Once the funds donated specifically for shirts are depleted, no more requests will be granted.

When completing your Application for Financial Assistance, keep in mind that if the section for Explanation of Need is not completed or if your unit leader's signature and contact information is not completed, your application will be returned to you. Our committee is unable to assess true "need" if household income and/or an explanation of need are not provided.

Handbooks and patches are a minimal expense to families if assistance is granted.

Veterans of Foreign Wars (VFW) "Voice of Democracy" Scholarship Deadline for Application is Nov. 1st

Each year, nearly 40,000 high school students from across the country enter to win a share of the \$2.2 million in educational scholarships and incentives awarded through the VFW's Voice of Democracy audio-essay competition.

The VFW established the Voice of Democracy program (VOD) in 1947 to provide students grades 9-12 the opportunity to express themselves in regards to democratic ideas and principles.

The national first-place winner receives a \$30,000 scholarship paid directly to the recipient's American university, college or vocational/technical school. Other national scholarships range from \$1,000-\$16,000, and the first-place winner from each (State) VFW Department wins an all-expense-paid trip to Washington, D.C. New Cub Scout Adventure Program Webelos/Arrow of Light Transition - Option Added

The new option allows boys who earned their Webelos rank prior to June 2015 to continue using the current requirements and their current handbook to complete their Arrow of Light requirements.

The other option allows a boy to bridge into the new program using the new required adventures and also use activity pins earned in the current program but not applied to Webelos rank requirements to satisfy elective requirements in the new program.

The new program requirements for Webelos and Arrow of Light place a significant emphasis on the skills and concepts necessary for a successful transition into Boy Scouts. Den leaders are encouraged to review the new requirements closely and make the best decision for the boys in their den.

NOW HIRING - Youth Program Leaders Needed in Kokomo, Marion and Peru
