What unit leaders need to know about University of Scouting

- All participants must be scheduled on <u>Campmaster</u>. A helpful guide on how to schedule participants can be found <u>here</u>
- Registration will begin at 8am in <u>Beering Hall</u>. There will be a flag ceremony at 8:45, and courses and classes will begin at 9am.
- Parking is available at the Parking Garage on the corner of University St. and 2nd St. This is a 3-4 minute walk from Beering Hall. Since it is a Saturday and there is not a home football game you can park there without a permit.
- No walk in registrations can be accepted.
- Adults should bring something to take notes on. Instructor handouts will vary depending on the course, and we don't want you to miss out!
- Youth should bring something to take notes on, and any materials required.
- Climbing merit badge will have a set of special requirements. Look for the "CLIMBING MERIT BADGE NOTICE" to be posted as soon as details are confirmed with Purdue. All participants for this badge must be at least 13 years old.
- If taking Nuclear Science, a photo ID is required to tour the reactor. Your school ID will work fine for this purpose.
- If your unit has paid all fees prior to 11/9/2017 at 8am, your patches will be included in your check in packet. If not, they will be available upon full payment.
- Your check in packet will include a copy of the schedule for each participant, a master listing for all classes, room assignments, and a number of wristbands for the participants you have paid for. These wristbands should be worn all day, and will be your meal ticket.
- Lunch will be pizza, a dessert of some type, and a water bottle.
- Merit Badge requirements will be entered into Campmaster by or before 11/22 at 5pm. This information will also list any requirements still needed to be completed to finish the badge ("Partials")
- Adults who took position required trainings will have those recorded by 11/22. We will also submit the CPR and First Aid records on Scoutnet at that time. First Aid and CPR Certification cards will be distributed as soon as they are provided by the instructor.
- Most merit badges will be a 3 hour offering in both the morning and afternoon. Some special exceptions are noted in the chart. Some will have age requirements or special materials that need to be brought with the Scout.
