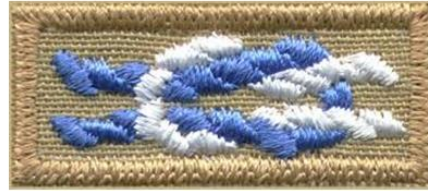

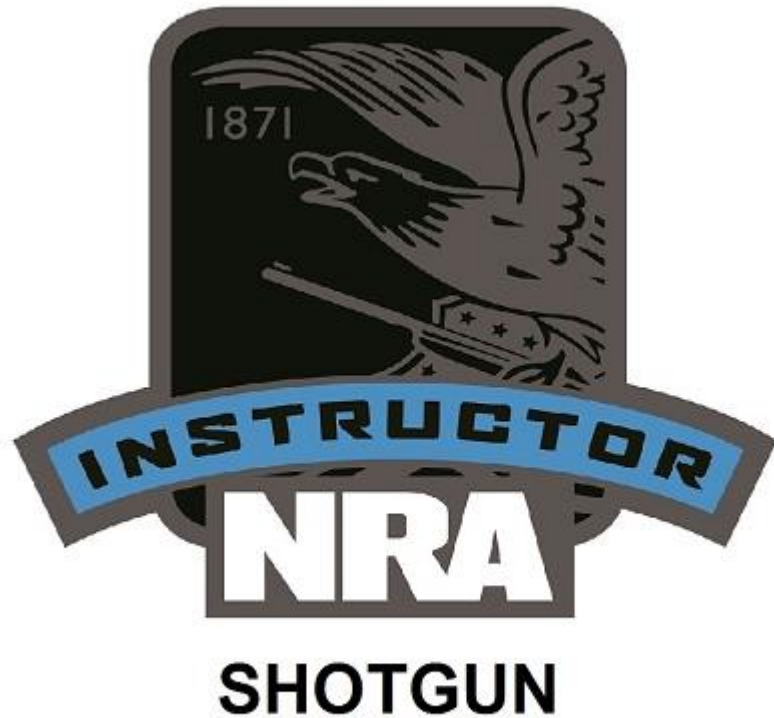

- How to give a proper safety briefing prior to a shooting event

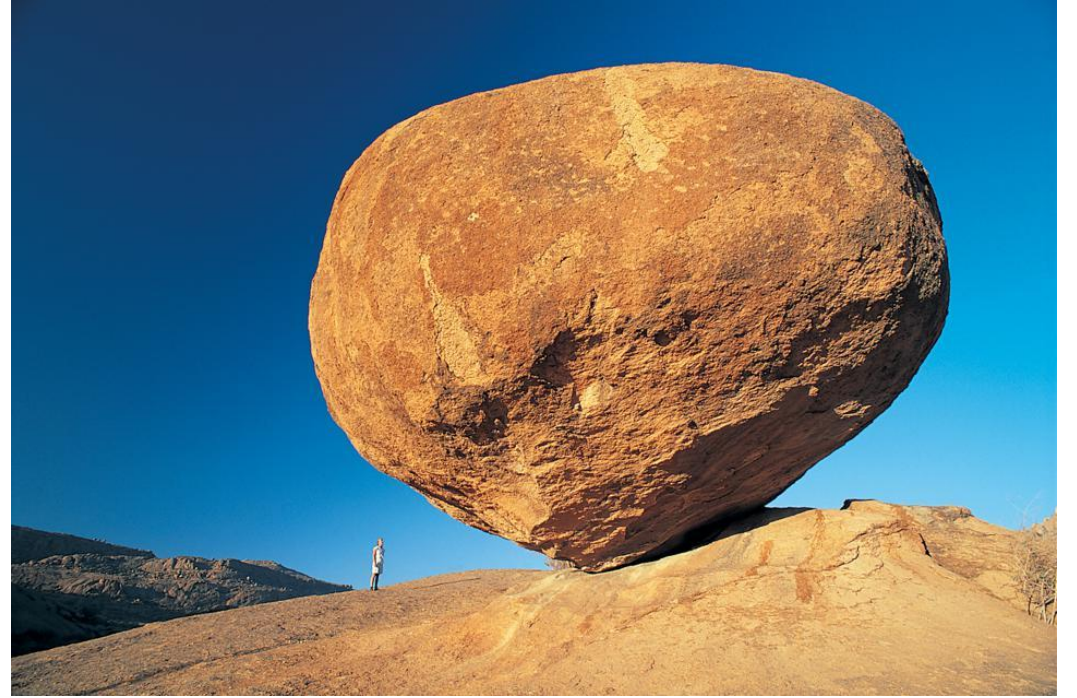

Introduction to Outdoor Leader Skills and Basic Adult Leader Outdoor Orientation

- March 13-14, 2021 at Cary Camp
- Registration will be open on Black Pug in the next 24 hours.
- Participants will get credit for completing both courses.
- Working as patrols, this hands-on course provides adult leaders the practical outdoor skills they need to lead Scouts in the out-of-doors. Upon completion, leaders should feel comfortable teaching Scouts the basic skills required to obtain the First Class rank. Along with Scoutmaster Specifics, this course is required of all direct contact leaders registered in Boy Scout Troops to be considered “trained”.
- BALOO is designed as an introduction to the Cub Scout outdoor program for leaders interested in adding a camping component to their Pack activities. BALOO training consists of an online pre-requisite component in addition to an overnight hands-on practical. BSA’s Cub Scout level camping policies will be taught along with the discovery of the necessary tools to help units carry out a successful camping experience. Completion of this course is mandatory for a MINIMUM OF ONE adult on a Pack overnighter.

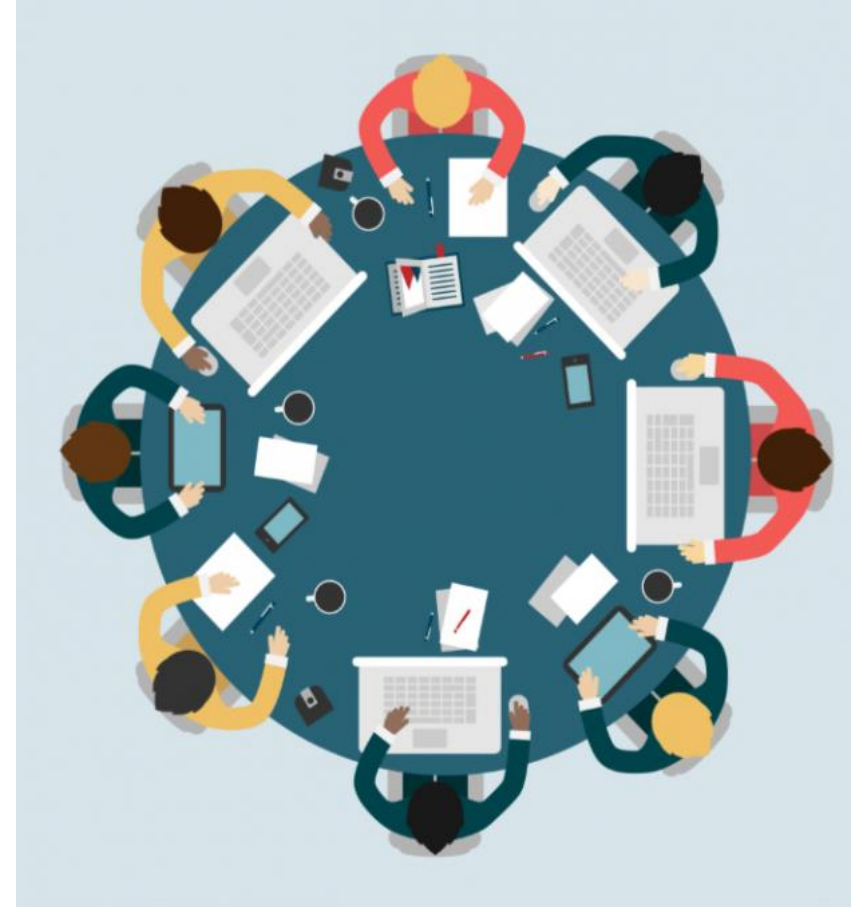
